

# Personal Hygiene Disposal in men's washrooms

**INCONTINENCE** is a common side effect of a **prostatectomy**. **23,000** men were **diagnosed** with **PROSTATE CANCER** in 2019.

**Most men's washrooms** aren't equipped to **safely dispose** of personal **hygiene products** – leaving men to flush them down the toilet. **This can cause blockages.**

Men are left to dispose of Personal Hygiene Products in **garbage bins** which creates a breeding ground for the **transfer of harmful bacteria**.

If facilities proactively adopt pro-trans policies, instead of waiting for a transgender person to pave the way, there's much less chance of having problems down the line.

**Advocacy is the most important part** of the fight for transgender rights.



There are about **375,000 transgender** people in **Canada**, **2/3** of which **avoid using public washrooms** for fear of being outed or physically and verbally assaulted.
