INCONTINENCE is a common side effect of a prostatectomy. 23.000 men were diagnosed with PROSTATE CANCER in 2019.

Most men's washrooms aren't equipped to safely dispose of personal hygiene products – leaving men to flush them down the toilet. This can cause blockages.

Men are left to dispose of Personal Hygiene Products in **garbage bins** which creates a breeding ground for the **transfer of harmful bacteria**. If facilities proactively adopt pro-trans policies, instead of waiting for a transgender person to pave the way, there's much less chance of having problems down the line.
